Page 9

bye (excl) /baɪ/ - ahoj (při loučení)

Bye is a short word for 'goodbye'; to say you are leaving people, or when people leave you. • **'Bye! See you tomorrow!'**

close (v) /kləʊz/ - zavřít

Close your book means to shut your book. • **'Please close your book when you've finished.'** said the teacher.

goodbye (excl) /ˌɡʊdˈbaɪ/ - ahoj (při loučení)

Goodbye is a word to say you are leaving people, or when people leave you. • **'Goodbye, Mrs Lowe. Have a good trip.'**

hello (excl) /həˈləʊ/ - ahoj (při setkání)

Hello is what you say when you meet a person. • **'Hello, Jo! It's nice to see you.'**

hi (excl) /haɪ/ - ahoj (při setkání)

Hi is a short word for saying 'hello' when you meet a person. • **'Hi, friend! How are you?'**

my name is (phr) /maɪ neɪm ɪz/ - jmenuji se

If you say **'my name is'**, you are telling a person who you are. • **'My name is Emma.'**

open (v) /'əʊpən/ - otevřít

Open your book means to make your book ready to use. • **'Please open your book at page 5.'** said the teacher.

put your hand up (phr) /pʊt jɔː hænd ʌp/ - zvedni ruku

If you **put your hand up**, you put it in the air to tell the teacher that you want to speak. • **'Please put your hand up if you know the answer,'** said the teacher.

sit down (ph v) /sɪt daʊn/ - posad' se

If you **sit down**, you put your body on a chair, or on the floor. • **'Sit down, please, class.'** said the teacher.

stand up (ph v) /stænd ʌp/ - vstát; postavit se

If you **stand up**, you get up from a chair or the floor. • **'Please stand up if you like the colour blue.'**

classmate (n) /'klɑːs, meɪt/ - spolužák

A **classmate** is another student in your class at school. • **'If you haven't got a pencil, you can borrow one from a classmate.'**

friend (n) /frend/ - kamarád

Your **friend** is a person you like to spend time with. • **'Sacha is my best friend.'**

name (n) /neɪm/ - jméno

Your **name** is the word you use to say who you are. • **'What is your name?'**

teacher (n) /'tiːtʃə(r)/ - učitel

A **teacher** is a person who helps you learn. • **'My teacher teaches me maths.'**

boy (n) /bɔɪ/ - chlapec

A **boy** is a male child. • **'The boy is reading a book in the garden.'**

girl (n) /gɜːl/ - dívka

A **girl** is a female child. • **'The girl is playing with a ball.'**

kid (n) /kɪd/ - dítě (hovorově)

A **kid** is another word for a child. • **'I played with other kids at the park.'**

student (n) /'stjuːdnt/ - student

A **student** is a person who learns at school. • **'I am a student in Mr Antonio's class.'**

new (adj) /njuː/ - nový

Something **new** is a thing that is just made, just arrived or not used. • **'Our mum gave us some new books to read.'**

nice (adj) /naɪs/ - hezký (věc); milý (člověk)

If you are **nice**, you are kind and friendly. • **'He is nice because he shares his toys.'**

park (n) /pɑːk/ - park

A **park** is a place to play outside. • **'We went to the park after school.'**

thing (n) /θɪŋ/ - věc

A **thing** is an object or an item. • **'We put our things away.'**

Page 26

grandad (n) /'grændæd/ - dědeček

Your **grandad** is your dad or mum's dad. • *My **granddad** tells me stories.*

Page 27

brother (n) /'brʌðə(r)/ - bratr

Your **brother** is a boy who has the same mum and dad as you. • *My **brother** likes playing basketball.*

dad (n) /dæd/ - táta

Your **dad** is your male parent. • *His **dad** started to make dinner.*

family (n) /'fæməli/ - rodina

A **family** is people who live together and love each other. • *My **family** is very special to me.*

father (n) /'fɑːðə(r)/ - otec

Father is another word for 'dad'. • *My **father** works in the city.*

grandma (n) /'grænmɑː/ - babička

Your **grandma** is your dad or mum's mum. • *Leo visits his **grandma** every weekend.*

mother (n) /'mʌðə(r)/ - matka

Mother is another word for 'mum'. • *Mai's **mother** is a doctor.*

mum (n) /mʌm/ - máma

Your **mum** is your female parent. • *My **mum** makes my lunch every day.*

parents (n) /'peərənts/ - rodiče

Your **parents** are your mum and dad. • *My **parents** help me with my homework.*

sister (n) /'sɪstə(r)/ - sestra

Your **sister** is a girl who has the same mum and dad as you. • *My **sister** likes to play with me.*

baby (n) /'beɪbi/ - miminko

A **baby** is a very young child. • *The **baby** is sleeping.*

big (adj) /bɪg/ - velký

A **big** thing is large in size. • *We are a **big** family, so we need a big car.*

people (n) /'piːpl/ - lidé

People is when there is more than one person. • *There are many **people** at the party.*

person (n) /'pɜːsn/ - osoba; člověk

A **person** is a human being. • *This **person** is my teacher.*

small (adj) /smɔːl/ - malý

A **small** thing is little in size. • *The dog was very **small**, but it was very noisy.*

funny (adj) /'fʌni/ - legrační

Something **funny** makes you laugh. • *The film we saw was **funny**.*

happy (adj) /'hæpi/ - šťastný

If you are **happy**, you feel good and smile. • *I am **happy** because I can see my friends.*

sad (adj) /sæd/ - smutný

If you are **sad**, you are not happy. • *I feel **sad** because I lost my bag.*

short (adj) /ʃɔːt/ - malý; krátký

If someone is **short**, they are lower than other people. • *My dad is **short**, so he can't take things off the kitchen shelf.*

tall (adj) /tɔːl/ - vysoký

If someone is **tall**, they are higher than other people. • *My sister is **tall**, so she can put things on the kitchen shelf.*

bird (n) /bɜːd/ - pták

A **bird** is an animal that flies. • *The **bird** was flying in the sky.*

fun (n) /fʌn/ - legrace

Fun is something that you enjoy and that makes you happy. • *We had so much **fun** playing the game!*

story (n) /'stɔːri/ - příběh

A **story** is a lot of words about things that happen, that a person tells or reads from a book. • *The teacher read us a **story** about people and animals on a boat.*

world (n) /wɜːld/ - svět

The **world** is everything that is around us. • *The **world** is a very big place.*

Page 44

art (n) /ɑ:t/ - umění; výtvarná výchova

Art is when you make pictures or things. • *Leo likes to draw art with coloured pencils.*

English (n) /'ɪŋɡlɪʃ/ - angličtina

English is the language spoken in the UK, US, Australia and many other countries across the world. • *I am learning to speak English.*

IT (n) /aɪ'ti:/ - IT

IT is where you learn about computers. • *In IT lessons, we use the computer.*

maths (n) /mæθs/ - matematika

Maths is where you learn numbers. • *You will need a ruler for today's maths lesson.*

Monday (n) /'mʌndeɪ/ - pondělí

Monday is the first day of the week. • *Monday is the first day of the school week.*

science (n) /'saɪəns/ - přírodověda

Science is learning how things work in the world. • *In science, we learn about animals and plants*

Tuesday (n) /'tʃu:zdeɪ/ - úterý

Tuesday is the second day of the week. • *I have swimming lessons on Tuesday.*

Wednesday (n) /'wenzdeɪ/ - středa

Wednesday is the third day of the week. • *Wednesday is when we have art class.*

Friday (n) /'fraɪdeɪ/ - pátek

Friday is the fifth day of the week. • *Friday is my favourite day!*

music (n) /'mju:zɪk/ - hudba; hudební výchova

Music is where you learn about sound and songs. • *I love listening to music.*

Thursday (n) /'θɜ:zdeɪ/ - čtvrtek

Thursday is the fourth day of the week. • *I have science lessons on Thursday.*

backpack (n) /'bækpæk/ - batoh

A **backpack** is a bag you carry on your back. • *I put my lunch in my backpack.*

desk (n) /dɛsk/ - lavice; pracovní stůl

A **desk** is a table where you sit and work. • *My desk has my books on it.*

laptop (n) /'læptɒp/ - notebook

A **laptop** is a small computer that is easy to carry around.

• *I'm using my mum's laptop to do my homework.*

notebook (n) /'nəʊtbʊk/ - sešit

A **notebook** is a book that you write in. • *I write my notes in a notebook.*

paper (n) /'peɪpə(r)/ - papír

Paper is a thing that you write or draw on. • *I need paper to do my drawing.*

pencil (n) /'pensl/ - tužka

A **pencil** is a thing you use to write or draw. • *I use a pencil to write my name.*

blue (adj/n) /blu:/ - modrý

Blue is the colour of the sky or sea. • *My book is blue.*

green (adj/n) /gri:n/ - zelený

Green is the colour of grass and many plants. • *I coloured in the grass green on my drawing.*

orange (adj/n) /'ɒrɪndʒ/ - oranžový; pomeranč

Orange is the colour of a fruit with the same name. • *Orange is my brother's favourite colour.*

red (adj/n) /red/ - červený; rudý

Red is the colour of apples and danger. • *I ate a red apple for lunch.*

yellow (adj/n) /'jeləʊ/ - žlutý

Yellow is the colour of the sun and a banana. • *The sun is yellow.*

outside (adv/n) /'aʊt'saɪd/ - ven; venku

When you go **outside**, you leave the building. • *There is a lovely big garden outside.*

plant (n) /plɑ:nt/ - rostlina

A **plant** is a thing that lives and grows; many plants have flowers.

*I give water to the **plants** in the classroom every Tuesday and Friday.*

question (n) /'kwɛstʃən/ - otázka

A **question** is something you ask to learn more about something.

• *I have a **question** about the story.*

watch videos (phr) /wɒtʃ 'vɪdiəʊz/ - sledovat videa

If you **watch videos**, you look at moving pictures on a screen.

• *I like to watch funny **videos**.*

Page 62

bedroom (n) /'bedru:m/ - ložnice

A **bedroom** is where you sleep. • *My **bedroom** has a bed and a small sofa.*

dining room (n) /'daɪnɪŋ ru:m/ - jídelna

A **dining room** is where you can eat your meals. • *We always eat dinner in the **dining room**.*

downstairs (adv/n) /,daʊn'steəz/ - dole; dolu (v přízemí)

You say **downstairs** to talk about the bottom floor of a house. • *My sister went **downstairs** to get her bag.*

kitchen (n) /'kɪtʃn/ - kuchyně

A **kitchen** is where you cook and make food to eat. • *Put the dishes in the **kitchen**. We can wash them later.*

upstairs (adv/n) /,ʌp'steəz/ - nahoře; nahoru (v patře)

You say **upstairs** to talk about the top floor of a house. • *We went **upstairs** to go to bed.*

window (n) /'wɪndəʊ/ - okno

A **window** is a glass part in a wall to see outside. • *It's hot in here. Can I open the **window**?*

bathroom (n) /'bɑ:θru:m/ - koupelna (většinou se záchodem)

The **bathroom** is where you wash or use the toilet. • *I wash my hands in the **bathroom**.*

door (n) /dɔ:/ - dveře

A **door** is where you come in or go out. • *Close the **door** when you come into my bedroom.*

home (n) /həʊm/ - domov

Your **home** is where you live. • *We had a good holiday but I can't wait to be in my **home**!*

house (n) /haʊs/ - dům

A **house** is the building where people live. • *All of my family lives in one **house**.*

living room (n) /'lɪvɪŋ ru:m/ - obývací pokoj

The **living room** is where you sit, talk, play games and watch TV. • *We watch TV in the **living room**.*

bed (n) /bed/ - postel

A **bed** is the thing you sleep in. • *I sleep in my **bed** at night.*

chair (n) /tʃeə/ - židle

A **chair** is a thing you sit on that has a back. • *I'm sitting on a **chair** at the table.*

flat (n) /flæt/ - byt

A **flat** is a place where people live, usually in a big building. • *My family live in a **flat** on the second floor.*

shower (n) /'ʃaʊə/ - sprcha; sprchový kout

A **shower** is where you wash your body with water and soap. • *Our hotel room has a **shower** but no bath.*

sofa (n) /'səʊfə/ - pohovka

A **sofa** is a soft seat where more than one person can sit. • *We sit on the **sofa** to watch TV.*

table (n) /'teɪbəl/ - stůl

A **table** is a flat thing with legs where you put things. • *I eat my food at the **table**.*

bookshelf (n) /'bʊkʃelf/ - police na knihy

A **bookshelf** is a place to keep books. • *All my books are on the **bookshelf** in my bedroom.*

painting (n) /'peɪntɪŋ/ - obraz

A **painting** is a picture made with paint. • *The **painting** on the wall is beautiful.*

wall (n) /wɔ:l/ - zeď

A **wall** is the side of a room. • *There is a picture on the **wall**.*

wardrobe (n) /'wɔ:drəʊb/ - šatní skříň

A **wardrobe** is a big cupboard where you keep clothes. • *I found this old dress in my **wardrobe**.*

café (n) /'kæfeɪ/ - levná restaurace

A **café** is a place where you can buy and eat food. • *We eat lunch at the **café**.*

city (n) /'sɪti/ - město (velké)

A **city** is a big town with many buildings. • *The **city** has tall buildings.*

playground (n) /'pleɪgraʊnd/ - hřiště

A **playground** is a place outside with things that you can play

on.

• *Let's go to the **playground** and play on the swings.*

ride bike (phr) /raɪd baɪk/ - jezdit na kole

If you **ride a bike**, you use your feet to move on a bicycle.

• *We **ride bikes** in the park.*

animal (n) /'æni:mə/ - zvíře

An **animal** is a thing that lives and is not a plant. • *A cat is an **animal**.*

pet (n) /pɛt/ - domácí zvíře; mazlíček

A **pet** is an animal you keep at home. • *My **pet** is a fish.*

Page 81

cat (n) /kæt/ - kočka

A **cat** is a small pet animal that says 'meow'. • *My **cat** is soft and fluffy.*

dog (n) /dɒg/ - pes

A **dog** is a pet animal that says 'woof'. • *My **dog** loves to play with me.*

duck (n) /dʌk/ - kachna

A **duck** is a bird that swims and says 'quack'. • *The **duck** swims in the lake.*

fly (v) /flaɪ/ - létat

If an animal can **fly**, it can move through the air. • *The bird can **fly** high.*

frog (n) /frɒg/ - žába

A **frog** is a small animal that jumps and says 'ribbit'. • *The **frog** jumps into the river.*

horse (n) /hɔ:s/ - kůň

A **horse** is a big animal that people can ride. • *I love to ride a **horse**.*

jump (v) /dʒʌmp/ - skákat

If you **jump**, you push your body into the air with your legs. • *I can **jump** really high.*

rabbit (n) /'ræbɪt/ - králík

A **rabbit** is a small, soft animal with long ears. • *Our pet **rabbit** runs around the garden and likes carrots.*

run (v) /rʌn/ - běhat

If you **run**, you move fast on your feet. • *I can **run** very fast!*

swim (v) /swɪm/ - plavat

If you **swim**, you move in water. • *I like to **swim** in the sea.*

ear (n) /ɪə/ - ucho

Your **ear** is the part of your body you use to hear. • *My **ears** hear music.*

eye (n) /aɪ/ - oko

Your **eye** is the part of your body you use to see. • *I have brown **eyes**.*

head (n) /hɛd/ - hlava

Your **head** is the top part of your body. • *I have a hat on my **head**.*

leg (n) /lɛg/ - noha

Your **leg** is the part of your body you use to walk. • *I hurt my **leg** when I fell.*

tail (n) /teɪl/ - ocas

A **tail** is the part of an animal that it carries behind it. • *The dog moves its **tail** to show it is happy.*

fast (adj) /fɑ:st/ - rychlý

Fast is when a thing is moving quickly. • *The car is very **fast**.*

long (adj) /lɒŋ/ - dlouhý

Something **long** is not short. • *I have **long** hair.*

slow (adj) /sləʊ/ - pomalý

Slow is when a thing is not moving quickly. • *The bus is **slow** in the evening traffic.*

walk (v) /wɔ:k/ - chodit

If you **walk**, you move on your feet. • *Let's **walk** to the park.*

Page 87

feel (v) /fi:l/ - cítit (pocit)

You **feel** happy or sad if a thing makes you happy or sad. • *I **feel** happy when I'm with my friends.*

help (v) /hɛlp/ - pomoci

If you **help** a person do a thing, you make it easier for them. • *I **help** my friend with her homework.*

hospital (n) /hɒspɪt(ə)l/ - nemocnice

A **hospital** is a large building where doctors and nurses work to look after people who are ill or hurt. • *She had to go to **hospital** because of her accident.*

plane (n) /pleɪn/ - letadlo

A **plane** is a vehicle that flies in the sky. • *We fly on a **plane** to go on holiday.*

Unit 6 Ready for the Weather - Připraveni na počasí

Page 98

boots (n) /bu:ts/ - kotníkové boty; holínky

Boots are shoes that cover your feet and part of your legs.

• *I wear my **boots** when it's cold.*

clothes (n) /kləʊðz/ - oblečení

Clothes are things you wear to cover your body. • *I put on my **clothes** in the morning.*

hot (adj) /hɒt/ - horký

If something is **hot**, it is very warm. • *This coffee is too **hot** to drink.*

jeans (n) /dʒi:nz/ - džíný

Jeans are clothes that people wear on their legs; they are often blue.

• *I can wear **jeans** to school on a Friday.*

shoes (n) /ʃu:z/ - boty

Shoes are hard things you wear on your feet. • *Yesterday, my aunt bought my baby cousin her first **shoes**.*

shorts (n) /ʃɔ:ts/ - kraťasy

Shorts are clothes that cover your legs, but not all the way down to your feet. • *My brother wears **shorts** in the summer.*

T-shirt (n) /'ti:ʃɜ:t/ - tričko

A **T-shirt** is a simple, soft shirt that has short sleeves. • *I put my **T-shirt** on to play outside because the weather was hot.*

wear (v) /weə/ - nosit; mít na sobě

When you **wear** things, like clothes, you put them on your body.

• *I **wear** my sister's clothes sometimes.*

Page 99

cold (adj) /kəʊld/ - studený

If it is **cold**, it is not warm. • *It's **cold** outside, so I'm wearing a jacket.*

gloves (n) /glʌvz/ - rukavice

Gloves are soft things you wear on your hands to keep them warm.

• *I wear **gloves** in winter when it is cold.*

hat (n) /hæt/ - čepice; klobouk

A **hat** is a thing you wear on your head. • *I wear my **hat** in the sun.*

jacket (n) /'dʒækɪt/ - bunda; sako

A **jacket** is a warm coat. • *I put on my **jacket** because it was snowing.*

socks (n) /sɒks/ - ponožky

Socks are soft things you wear on your feet to keep them warm.

• *I wear **socks** with my shoes.*

baseball cap (n) /'beɪsbɔ:l 'kæp/ - čepice s kšiltem

A **baseball cap** is a hat that you wear in the sun. • *I wear a **baseball cap** to keep the sun out of my eyes.*

dress (n) /dres/ - šaty (dámské)

A **dress** is a thing you wear that has a top and a skirt. • *'You can wear your **dress** to the party,' said Mum.*

skirt (n) /skɜ:t/ - sukně

A **skirt** is a thing you wear that goes around the middle of your body and down over your legs like a curtain. • *She wears a **skirt** to school.*

sunglasses (n) /'sʌŋ,glɑ:sɪz/ - sluneční brýle

Sunglasses are glasses you wear so the sun doesn't hurt your eyes.

• *I wear **sunglasses** when it's sunny.*

sweatshirt (n) /'swetʃɜ:t/ - mikina

A **sweatshirt** is a warm shirt with long sleeves. • *I wear my **sweatshirt** to keep warm after we play football.*

rain (v) /'reɪn/ - pršet

It is **raining** when water falls from the sky. • *'Oh no, it's **raining** outside. We can't go out and play.'*

snow (v) /snəʊ/ - sněžit

It is **snowing** when snow falls from the sky. • *'It's **snowing**. Let's build a snowman!'*

sunny (adj) /'sʌni/ - slunečný

It is **sunny** when the sun is shining. • *'It's **sunny** today. Let's go outside!'*

windy (adj) /'wɪndi/ - větrný

It is **windy** when air moves a lot. • *'It's **windy**. My hat won't stay on my head.'*

camping (n) /'kæmpɪŋ/ - kempování; táboření

Camping is where you sleep outside in a tent. • *We are going **camping** in the forest.*

fishing (n) /'fɪʃɪŋ/ - rybaření

Fishing is when you try and catch a fish from water. • *We went **fishing** by the lake.*

warm (adj) /wɔ:m/ - teplý

When it is **warm**, it is not too hot or too cold. • *I like the **warm** weather today.*

year (n) /jɪə(r)/ - rok

A **year** is 12 months. • *My family go camping once a **year**.*

Unit 7 Time for Fun! - Čas na legraci

Page 116

baseball (n) /'beɪsbɔ:l/ - baseball

Baseball is a sport where you hit a ball with a bat. • *My brother and sisters like to play **baseball** in the park.*

basketball (n) /'bɑ:skɪtbɔ:l/ - košíková

Basketball is a sport where you throw a ball through a circle into a net. • *I love to play **basketball** with my friends.*

dance (v) /dɑ:ns/ - tancovat

When you **dance**, you move your body to music. • *I like to **dance** to my favourite songs.*

draw (v) /drɔ:/ - kreslit

When you **draw**, you make pictures with coloured or black and white pencils. • *I like to **draw** pictures of my family and my pets.*

football (n) /'fʊtbɔ:l/ - fotbal

Football is a sport where you kick a ball into a goal. • *We play **football** at school in PE lessons.*

go (v) /gəʊ/ - jít; jet

If you **go** somewhere, you move from one place to another. • *We **go** to school by bus.*

guitar (n) /gɪ'tɑ:(r)/ - kytara

A **guitar** is a musical instrument with strings that you play. • *My sister plays the **guitar** at school.*

hobby (n) /'hɒbi/ - koníček

A **hobby** is something you like to do when you are not at school. • *My **hobby** is painting; my friend's **hobby** is drawing.*

piano (n) /pi'ænəʊ/ - klavír

A **piano** is a big musical instrument with black and white keys. • *They play the **piano** very well.*

play (v) /pleɪ/ - hrát

If you **play**, you have fun and do something with toys or games. If you **play** an instrument, you make it work. • *On Saturday, I **played** basketball in the morning, then in the afternoon I **played** my guitar with my dad.*

skateboard (n) /'skeɪtbɔ:d/ - skateboard

A **skateboard** is a thing with wheels you ride on, for fun or as a sport. • *I can ride my **skateboard** in the park.*

sport (n) /spɔ:t/ - sport

Sport is a game you play, like football or basketball. • *I like to play **sports** with my friends.*

video games (n) /'vɪdiəʊ geɪmz/ - videohry

Video games are games you play on a screen. • *I like to play **video games** on my computer.*

after school (adv phr) /'ɑ:ftə sku:l/ - po skončení vyučování
After school is the time when school is finished. • *I play with my friends **after school**.*

in the afternoon (adv phr) /In ði 'ɑ:ftə'nu:n/ - odpoledne
 If you do something **in the afternoon**, you do it after lunch.
 • *We go to the park **in the afternoon**.*

in the evening (adv phr) /In ði 'i:vnɪŋ/ - večer
 If you do something **in the evening**, you do it at the time when it starts getting dark. • *We have dinner **in the evening**.*

in the morning (adv phr) /In ðə 'mɔ:nɪŋ/ - ráno; dopoledne
 If you do something **in the morning**, you do it after breakfast but before lunch. • *I eat breakfast **in the morning**.*

on Saturday (adv phr) /ɒn 'sætədeɪ/ - v sobotu
 If you do something **on Saturday**, you do it at the weekend on the day after Friday. • *We are going to go to the zoo **on Saturday**.*

fifty (n) /'fɪfti/ - padesát
Fifty is the time when it is ten minutes before the hour. • *It was six **fifty** when her alarm clock went off.*

forty (n) /'fɔ:ti/ - čtyřicet
Forty is the time when it is twenty minutes before the hour.
 • *The clock said seven **forty**. It was time to go home.*

half past three (adv) /hɑ:f pɑ:st/ - půl čtvrté

Food is something you can eat. • *We cook all kinds of **food**.*

ice cream (n) /'aɪs kri:m/ - zmrzlina

Ice cream is a sweet, cold dessert made from milk. • *We have **ice cream** after dinner.*

milk (n) /mɪlk/ - mléko

Milk is a white drink from cows • *I have **milk** with my breakfast.*

noodles (n) /'nu:dlz/ - nudle

Noodles are long pieces of pasta. • *I like **noodles** with sauce.*

A **restaurant** is a place where you buy and eat food. • *We go to a **restaurant** for dinner on Saturdays.*
