sb who studies living things • *She's interested in plants and animals and wants to be a biologist when she grows up.* ➤ biology (n), biological (adj) ❖

**3.10 fascinated** (adj) /'fæsəneɪtɪd/ - fascinovaný  
very interested • *I'm fascinated by whales. They're such beautiful creatures.* ➤ fascinate (v), fascinating (adj) ❖

**3.11 coral reef** (n) /'kɒrəl ri:f/ - korálový útes  
a long narrow line of coral, rocks and other substances near the surface of the sea • *You can swim in the sea and look at the beautiful coral reef.* ❖

**3.12 appearance** (n) /ə'piərəns/ - vzhled  
the way sb/sth looks • *'Can you describe his appearance?' 'Well, he's tall and thin and has brown hair.'* ➤ appear (v) ❖

used to emphasise a fact • *I actually fell asleep in the lesson because I was so tired.* ➤ actual (adj) ❖

to form (sth) • *The team is made up of local volunteers.* ❖

**3.15 polyp** (n) /'pɒlɪp/ - polyp  
a tiny animal that lives in the sea • *There are many polyps which make the coral reefs.* ❖

**3.16 create** (v) /kri'eɪt/ - vytvořit  
to make, cause to exist • *You can create a beautiful garden by planting a variety of flowers.* ➤ creature, creation (n), creative (adj) ❖

**3.17 skeleton** (n) /'skelɪtən/ - kostra  
all the bones of a body • *Do you know how many bones there are in an adult human skeleton?* ❖

**3.18 limestone** (n) /'laɪmstəʊn/ - vápenec  
a rock that is made of calcium carbonate  
(CaCO<sub>3</sub>) • *People used limestone to build  
ancient buildings like the pyramids.* ❖

to lie on the surface of something • *The  
snow had covered the garden when we  
woke up and looked outside.* ➤ cover (n)

that can be seen • *The bright red flowers  
were visible from a distance.* ➤ visibility

**3.23 beauty** (n) /'bju:ti/ - krása  
the quality of being beautiful • *Her  
paintings showed the beauty of the island.*  
➤ beautiful (adj) ❖

**3.24 algae** (n pl) /'ældʒi:/ - řasy  
simple plants without roots or stems that  
grow in or around water • *The lake was  
covered in blue-green algae.* ❖

**3.25 although** (conj) /ɔ:l'ðəʊ/ - ačkoli  
even though; used to introduce a clause of  
contrast • *Although he knows some words  
in French, he isn't able to speak the  
language.* ❖

**3.26 species** (n) /'spi:ʃi:z/ - druh(y)  
a type of plant or animal • *The forest is  
home to several species of bats.* ❖

**3.27 provide** (v) /prə'vaɪd/ - poskytnout  
to give • *Nature provides new mothers  
with milk to feed their babies.* ➤ provision  
(n) ❖

**3.28 protect** (v) /prə'tekt/ - chránit  
to make sure that sb/sth is not harmed  
• *You must protect your little brother and  
not let anything bad happen to him.* ➤

protection (n), protective (adj),  
protectively (adv) ❖

the land next to the sea • *We live in a  
village on the coast.* ➤ coastal (adj) ❖

how they lived many years ago.* ❖

to make sth clean and tidy • *The students

the pieces of sth/sb that are still visible  
when the other parts have been  
destroyed, eaten or removed, etc. •  
*Visitors can see the remains of the old  
Roman wall between Scotland and  
England.* ➤ remain (v) ❖

to come together and start to exist • *The  
limestone rocks were formed millions of  
years ago from the bodies of small  
organisms in the sea.* ➤ form (n) ❖

to keep sb/sth safe from harm • *The brave  
firefighter saved the dog from the burning
