not eating or including meat or fish • *This is the first vegetarian meal I've had and it is delicious!* ➤ vegetarian, vegetarianism (n) ❖

**2.9 vegan** (adj) /'vi:gən/ - veganský; not eating meat, fish, dairy products or using materials made from parts of animals • *It's hard to find vegan products in my town.* ➤ vegan, veganism (n) ❖

**2.10 option** (n) /'ɒpʃn/ - možnost; choice • *I don't know what food to prepare for the party, but I think salads and sandwiches are the best options.* ➤ opt (v), optional (adj) ❖

**2.11 quality** (n) /'kwɒləti/ - kvalita; how good or bad sth is • *The quality of the vegetables at the market is much better than the ones at the supermarket.* ❖

**2.12 article** (n) /'ɑ:tɪkl/ - článek; a piece of writing about something in a newspaper, on a website, etc. • *Have you read this article about healthy eating? It's really interesting.* ❖

**2.13 blog** (n) /blɒg/ - blog; a series of articles on a website that sb writes about events, opinions, etc. • *Have you read our new travel blog following the adventures of Heracles?* ➤ blog (v), blogger (n) ❖

**2.14 recommendation** (n) /,rekəmen'deɪʃn/ - doporučení; a suggestion to sb that they should choose, see, buy, etc., a thing that you think is good • *The critics' recommendations helped to make the film successful at the box office.* ➤ recommend (v) ❖


**2.15 dessert** (n) /dɪ'zɜ:t/ - zákusek; sweet food served as the last course of a meal • *This strawberry cheesecake is a delicious dessert.* ❖

**2.16 home-made** (adj) /,həʊm 'meɪd/ - domácí

made at home, not bought from a shop • *The smell of fresh home-made bread filled the air.* ❖

**2.17 taste** (v) /teɪst/ - chutnat  
to have a particular flavour • *This yoghurt tastes delicious with a little honey.* ➤  
tasty, tasteless (adj), taste (n) ❖

**2.18 treat** (n) /tri:t/ - pamlsek; něco dobrého  
sth special you give sb or do for them because they will enjoy it • *It's your birthday, so I got you a treat – strawberry cheesecake.* ➤ treat (v) ❖

**2.19 inexpensive** (adj) /,ɪnɪk'spensɪv/ - levný  
cheap • *A simple meal of pasta with cheese is inexpensive to buy and quick to make.* ❖  Opp: expensive

**2.20 craft** (n) /kra:ft/ - řemeslo; zručnost  
an activity that needs artistic and practical skills, e.g. making clothes or jewellery • *Tony's creative and loves doing arts and crafts.* ❖

**2.21 owner** (n) /'əʊnə/ - majitel  
sb who owns sth • *Mr Marquez, who's from Spain, is the owner of this Spanish restaurant.* ➤ own (v) ❖

**2.22 head chef** (n) /,hedʃef/ - šéfkuchař  
the most important cook in a restaurant  
• *Sanjay is the head chef in a hotel restaurant in London.* ❖

**2.23 menu** (n) /'menju:/ - jídelní lístek  
a list of the food you can order at a restaurant • *The restaurant has an interesting menu. What would you like to order?* ❖

**2.24 award** (n) /ə'wɔ:d/ - cena; ocenění  
a prize given to sb who has done sth special • *Fabio's has won an award for being the country's best restaurant of the year.* ➤ award (v) ❖

**2.25 ground floor** (n) /graʊnd flɔ:/ - přízemí  
the floor at the same level as the ground • *We were given the keys to our hotel room, which was on the ground floor.* ❖

**2.26 designer** (adj) /di'zainə(r)/ - značkový  
selling famous brand names of clothes and accessories • *The high street is full of designer shops that sell expensive clothes, shoes and bags.* ➤ design (n, v) ❖

**2.27 district** (n) /'dɪstrɪkt/ - okres; obvod  
an area of a country or city • *They live in an expensive district in the north of the city.* ❖

**2.28 definitely** (adv) /'defɪnətli/ - rozhodně  
without a doubt, certainly • *We will definitely eat out on your birthday.* ➤  
definite (adj) ❖

**2.29 occasion** (n) /ə'keɪʒn/ - událost; příležitost  
a special event • *Their wedding was a very important occasion in their lives.* ❖

**2.30 award-winning** (adj) /ə'wɔ:d ,wɪnɪŋ/ - oceněný  
that has won an award • *The award-winning author, David Williams, signed copies of his latest book for customers in the bookshop.* ❖

**2.31 absolutely** (adv) /'æbsəlu:tli/ - naprosto  
completely • *Thank you for your present. It's absolutely lovely.* ➤ absolute (adj) ❖

**2.32 high-quality** (adj) /haɪ 'kwɒləti/ - vysoké kvality  
very good and well-made • *The shop sells high-quality shoes which are not too expensive.* ❖

**2.33 ingredient** (n) /ɪn'gri:diənt/ - přísada; složka  
one of the things put with others to make sth • *The main ingredient of this sauce is cheese.* ❖

**2.34 regular** (adj) /'regjələ(r)/ - pravidelný; častý  
that is often done as a habit; that happens often or usually • *Nick is a regular visitor to the library. He reads a lot of books every week.* ➤ regularly (adv) ❖

**2.35 stew** (n) /stju:/ - dušené maso se zeleninou

a meal of meat and/or vegetables cooked slowly like a thick soup • *In winter, the Irish make traditional hot stew with meat and vegetables.* ❖

**2.36 meatball** (n) /'mi:tɒ:l/ - masová kulička

a kind of food made with small pieces of meat and other ingredients made into a ball and cooked • *His favourite dish is spaghetti with meatballs and tomato sauce.* ❖

**2.37 beef** (n) /bi:f/ - hovězí

meat from a cow • *Angela is cooking beef and potatoes in the oven for Sunday lunch.* ❖

**2.38 queue** (n) /kju:/ - fronta; řada

a line of people who are waiting for something • *We had to wait in a long queue to get into the cinema.* ➤ queue (v) ❖

**2.39 stylish** (adj) /'stailɪʃ/ - elegantní; moderní

fashionable and attractive • *The hotel had beautiful rooms and a stylish restaurant by the pool.* ➤ style (n) ❖

**2.40 seafood** (n) /'sifu:d/ - mořské plody  
fish and shellfish • *This restaurant serves seafood like lobster, crab and prawns.* ❖

**2.41 diner** (n) /'daɪnə(r)/ - malá, levná restaurace

a small cheap restaurant, especially in the USA • *We had a snack at a diner on the road to Los Angeles.* ➤ dine (v) ❖

**2.42 fries** (n pl) /fraɪz/ - hranolky  
long thin pieces of potato cooked in oil • *This fish dish comes with fries or rice.*

*Whatever you prefer.* ❖ 📖 Syn: French fries (US Eng), chips (Br Eng)

**2.43 milkshake** (n) /'mɪlkʃeɪk/ - mléčný koktejl

a drink made with milk mixed with different flavours, e.g. fruit • *I had a cool banana milkshake at the café.* ❖

**2.44 retro** (adj) /'retrəʊ/ - retro

in a style from the recent past • *The band played retro music from the 1960s.* ❖

**2.45 drive** (n) /draɪv/ - jízda autem  
a journey by car • *We went for a drive to the lake.* ➤ drive (v), driver (n) ❖

**2.46 liquid** (n) /'lɪkwɪd/ - tekutina  
sth that can be poured like water • *Milk and water are both liquids.* ❖

**2.47 recommend** (v) /,rekə'mend/ - doporučit

to suggest • *I recommend the seafood because it is very fresh.* ➤

recommendation (n) ❖

**2.48 light** (adj) /laɪt/ - lehký

in a small amount that's easy to eat • *They ordered a light meal of fresh salad and cheese.* ❖

**2.49 snack** (n) /snæk/ - svačina

a small meal • *We just had a snack of fruit and biscuits this afternoon, but we'll have a big dinner tonight.* ➤ snack (v) ❖

**2.50 therefore** (adv) /'ðeəfɔ:(r)/ - proto  
as a result (of sth just mentioned) • *There were no seats in the restaurant. Therefore, we decided to get a takeaway.* ❖

**2.51 choice** (n) /tʃɔɪs/ - volba; výběr  
sth that you can select from different things • *Everything on the menu sounded delicious, so it was difficult to make a choice about what to order.* ➤ choose (v)

**2.52 suitable** (adj) /'su:təbl/ - vhodný  
right or appropriate • *You can't go running in those shoes. They aren't suitable.* ➤ suit (v), suitably (adv),

suitability (n) ❖ 📖 Opp: unsuitable

**2.53 active** (adj) /'æktɪv/ - aktivní  
always moving about, doing different things • *Lydia likes to keep active and she goes for a long run every day.* ➤ activity, action (n), actively (adv), act (n, v) ❖

**2.54 celebrate** (v) /'selɪbreɪt/ - slavit  
to do something enjoyable for a special reason • *We had a party to celebrate the end of our school year.* ➤ celebration (n)

**2.55 rock and roll** (n) /,rɒk ən 'rəʊl/ - rokenrol

a kind of music that became popular in the 1950s • *Elvis Presley was my grandma's favourite rock and roll singer.* ❖

to cook sth in an oven • *Christina bakes her own bread for all the family.* ➤ baking (adj, n), baked (adj), baker, bakery (n) ❖

**2.62 barbecue** (v) /'ba:bkju:/ - venkovní grilování  
to cook food over a fire outdoors • *Let's barbecue some chicken in the garden and invite our friends for lunch.* ➤ barbecue (n) ❖  Also: barbeque

**2.63 boil** (v) /bɔɪl/ - vřít; vařit (ve vodě)  
to heat sth until it is very hot and it starts to change into steam; to cook sth in liquid

• *Can you boil some eggs for breakfast, please?* ➤ boiling, boiled (adj) ❖

**2.64 fry** (v) /fraɪ/ - smažit  
to cook in hot oil • *Let's fry some sausages and eggs for breakfast.* ➤ fried (adj) ❖

**2.65 grill** (v) /grɪl/ - grilovat  
to cook food under a very hot surface in a cooker • *It's healthier to grill meat than to fry it.* ➤ grill (n), grilled (adj) ❖

**2.66 roast** (v) /rəʊst/ - péct (suchým žářem)  
to cook food, e.g. meat, without liquid in an oven • *Ted is roasting a chicken with potatoes in the oven for dinner.* ➤ roast (n, adj) ❖

**2.67 lamb** (n) /læm/ - jehně; jehněčí  
a young sheep; the meat from a young sheep • *The chef is cooking a traditional meal of roast lamb.* ❖

**2.68 chop** (n) /tʃɒp/ - kotleta  
a piece of meat served with the bone on it • *We could smell the lamb chops cooking on the barbecue.* ➤ chopped (adj), chop (v) ❖

**2.69 steak** (n) /steɪk/ - steak  
a thick, flat piece of meat • *Would you like steak or fish for dinner?* ❖

**2.70 theory** (n) /'θiəri/ - teorie  
an idea that explains why sth happens • *At first, Dennis didn't believe the theory that people can live without meat, but now he's completely vegan and feels great.* ❖

**2.71 soldier** (n) /'sɒldʒə(r)/ - voják  
a member of an army • *The soldiers all wore their uniforms and carried their weapons.* ❖

**2.72 saddle** (n) /'sædl/ - sedlo  
seat on a horse • *The saddle he was sitting on fell off the horse, and so did he!* ➤ saddle (v) ❖

**2.73 immigrant** (n) /'ɪmɪgrənt/ - přistěhovalec  
sb who comes to live in a country from another country • *Many immigrants open restaurants which serve food from their*

*home country.* ➤ immigrate (v), immigration (n) ❖

**2.74 sailor** (n) /'seɪlə(r)/ - námořník sb who works on a ship; sb who sails a boat • *The sailors brought their ship safely into the port.* ➤ sail (n, v), sailing (n) ❖

**2.121 mild** (adj) /maɪld/ - jemný  
not strong • *This yoghurt sauce gives the curry a mild taste so it's not too spicy.* ❖

**2.122 colourful** (adj) /'kʌləfʊl/ - barevný  
having bright colours; having a lot of colours • *People usually wear colourful costumes in the carnival parade.* ➤ colourfully (adv), colourless (adj), colour (n, v) ❖

**2.123 dull** (adj) /dʌl/ - nudný  
not interesting or exciting • *The old café's decor is dull and boring.* ❖

**2.124 processed food** (n) /'prəʊsest fu:d/ - polotovary  
prepared food, often in tins or packets • *It isn't good to eat a lot of processed food because it has fewer vitamins than fresh food.* ❖

not fizzy; without bubbles • *I prefer still water from the tap.* ❖

fizzy; containing bubbles • *She ordered a bottle of sparkling water with lemon flavour.* ❖
