4.2 prepare (v) /pri'peə(r)/ - připravit to make sth ready to use/eat • *Ken is preparing the salad for dinner.* ➤ preparation (n) ❖

4.3 eat out (phr v) /i:t aʊt/ - jíst mimo domov to have a meal at a restaurant • *I like eating out with my family at weekends. We often go to a fish restaurant near the sea.* ❖

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4.4 supermarket (n) /'su:pəmə:kit/ - samoobsluha a big shop where you can buy food and other things • *I'm going to the supermarket to buy some cat food.* ❖

4.5 recipe (n) /'resəpi/ - recept (na jídlo) instructions for making food • *Jeanne uses her grandma's recipe to make pizza.* ❖

4.6 cookbook (n) /'kʊkbʊk/ - kuchařka a book with recipes for making food • *Olivia wrote a cookbook with recipes for traditional Mexican dishes.* ❖

4.7 decide (v) /di'saɪd/ - rozhodnout (se) to think about things, and then make a choice • *Greta decided to order a pizza and watch a film.* ➤ decision (n), decisive (adj) ❖

4.8 match (n) /mætʃ/ - spojení; kombinace sth that goes well together with sth else and has similar qualities • *Fried chicken goes well with rice. They're the perfect match.* ➤ match (v) ❖

4.9 mainly (adv) /,meɪnli/ - hlavně mostly • *The island's restaurants serve*

mainly fish. ➤ main (adj) ❖

4.10 smart (adj) /smɑ:t/ - chytrý controlled by a computer so that it responds and acts by itself • *The smart lights outside our building switch on if you walk by at night.* ❖

4.11 meal (n) /mi:l/ - jídlo (připravené) the food you eat at one time, e.g. lunch, dinner • *We have a big meal in the evening when my parents come home from work.* ❖

4.12 ingredient (n) /ɪn'gri:diənt/ - přísada sth that is included to make or bake different food • *The main ingredients you need to make a cake are flour, eggs, sugar and butter or oil.* ❖

4.13 trolley (n) /'trɒli/ - nákupní vozík (UK) a shopping cart for carrying things in a shop • *The children put some more cereal into the shopping trolley.* ❖

4.14 credit card (n) /'kredit kɑ:d/ - kreditní karta a card from a bank which you can use to buy sth and pay for it later • *Can I pay for my tickets by credit card?* ❖

4.15 add up (phr v) /æd 'ʌp/ - sečíst to calculate the total of two or more numbers, prices, etc. • *If you add up the numbers in this line, you'll get 100.* ❖

4.16 save money (phr) /seɪv 'mʌni/ - šetřit peníze to keep money that you don't need to spend right now • *It's difficult to save money when you don't have a good job.* ❖

4.17 conclude (v) /kən'klu:d/ - zakončit to end a piece of writing or a speech • *I concluded my email with 'See you soon!'. ➤ conclusion (n), conclusive (adj) ❖*

4.18 diet (n) /'daɪət/ - strava; dieta what you usually eat • *It's important to include the right kind of food in your daily diet.* ➤ dietician (n), dietary (adj) ❖

4.19 habit (n) /'hæbɪt/ - zvyk sth you do regularly • *Alan is trying to improve his sleeping habits by not using the internet at night.* ❖

4.20 still (adv) /stɪl/ - stále
not stopping up to a certain time • *Dad's aunt is 90 and she still goes for long walks every day.* ❖

4.21 once (adv) /wʌns/ - jednou; kdysi
one time • *Sally played golf once, but she didn't enjoy it.* ❖

4.22 shopping list (n) /'ʃɒpɪŋ lɪst/ - nákupní seznam
a note that you write with all the things you need to buy • *I'll write a shopping list for the party food.* ❖

4.23 cupboard (n) /'kʌbəd/ - (kuchyňská) skříň(ka)
a piece of furniture that has space to store things in and has doors on the front
• *Put away your coat in the hall cupboard.* ❖

4.24 fridge (n) /frɪdʒ/ - lednice
an electronic device that keeps food and drinks cold • *Katrina put the milk and cheese into the fridge.* ❖

4.25 onion (n) /'ʌnjən/ - cibule
a hard round vegetable that has many layers inside and a purple or brown skin outside • *Cutting up onions always makes my eyes hurt.* ❖

4.26 delicious (adj) /dɪ'lɪʃəs/ - lahodný
having a very nice taste • *This cake is delicious. May I have another piece?* ❖

4.27 omelette (n) /'ɒmlət/ - omeleta
a dish made from mixing eggs together and frying them with other foods • *For breakfast, we sometimes have a cheese omelette with toast.* ❖

4.28 butter (n) /'bʌtə(r)/ - máslo
a soft yellow kind of fat made from cream
• *Do you like butter on your toast or just honey?* ➤ butter (v) ❖

4.29 automatically (adv) /ˌɔ:tə'mætɪkli/ - automaticky
without anybody touching a control or switch • *The oven goes off automatically when the time ends.* ➤ automatic (adj) ❖

4.30 perhaps (adv) /pə'hæps/ - možná
maybe • *Perhaps we'll go to the Thai*

restaurant on my birthday, but I'm not sure. ❖

4.31 (my) own (adj) /('maɪ) əʊn/ - vlastní
belonging to me • *I'd like to have my own car when I'm older.* ➤ own (v), owner (n)
❖

4.32 weigh (v) /weɪ/ - vážit
to measure sb/sth to see how heavy they are/it is; to have a particular weight • *Weigh the ingredients before you put them into the bowl.* ➤ weight (n) ❖

4.33 calculate (v) /'kælkjəleɪt/ - vypočítat
to work out an amount • *This watch can calculate how far you walk every day.*
➤ calculation (n) ❖

4.34 culture (n) /'kʌltʃə(r)/ - kultura
the beliefs, art and way of life in a country
• *We learnt a lot about Chinese food and culture on our holiday in Beijing.* ➤ cultural (adj) ❖

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4.35 meat (n) /mi:t/ - maso
the soft part of an animal's body that other animals eat as food • *Heather doesn't eat meat, so she ate a cheese pie.* ❖

4.36 garlic (n) /'gɑ:lɪk/ - česnek
a small vegetable with a very strong taste and smell • *Let's put some garlic sauce on the fish.* ❖

4.37 pasta (n) /'pæstə/ - těstoviny
spaghetti, noodles, etc. • *Italy is famous for its pasta dishes.* ❖

4.38 chilli (n) /'tʃɪli/ - čili paprička
a kind of small thin red or green pepper that has a very hot taste • *I put a few chillies in the sauce to make it spicy.* ❖

4.39 grapes (n) /greɪps/ - víno; hrozny
a small round green or dark red fruit that is soft inside • *On our farm, we grow juicy grapes.* ❖

4.40 mushroom (n) /'mʌʃrʊm/ - houba

a kind of fungus that has a soft round top and a thick stem • *I love mushrooms on my pizza.* ❖

4.41 pepper (n) /'pepə(r)/ - paprika
a kind of green, red or yellow vegetable that you can eat cooked or uncooked, e.g. in salads • *We made a salad with tomatoes, green peppers and onions.* ❖

4.42 lemon (n) /'lemən/ - citrón
a yellow fruit that has a bitter taste • *Mum likes to drink tea with honey and a piece of lemon.* ❖

4.43 vegetable (n) /'vedʒtəbl/ - zelenina
a plant or part of a plant that you can eat
• *Carrots are my favourite vegetables.* ❖

4.44 dairy (adj) /'deəri/ - mléčný
made from milk • *David has cows on his farm and he makes dairy foods like butter and milk.* ➤ dairy (n) ❖

4.45 fruit (n) /fru:t/ - ovoce
the soft part of a plant that has seeds inside • *Louisa eats a lot of fruit, like bananas and apples.* ❖

4.46 carbohydrate (n) /,kɑ:bəʊ'haidreit/ - sacharid
something in food like bread, potatoes and pasta which gives your body energy • *Maria eats a big meal with carbohydrates before she goes for a long walk.* ❖

4.47 cook (n) /kʊk/ - kuchař
a person who cooks food; sb who cooks food as a job • *My aunt is a good cook. She makes great pizzas.* ➤ cook (v), cooking (n), cooker (n) ❖

4.48 vegetarian (n) /,vedʒə'teəriən/ - vegetarián
a person who doesn't eat meat or fish
• *A lot of my friends are vegetarians because they love animals.* ➤ vegetarian (adj) ❖

4.49 strawberry (n) /'strɔ:bəri/ - jahoda
a small, juicy, red, summer fruit • *We're having ice cream with strawberries after lunch.* ❖

4.50 fresh (adj) /frefʃ/ - čerstvý
food that has been made, picked or collected not long ago • *There aren't*

many fresh strawberries in the shops in winter.

➤ freshness (n), freshly (adv) ❖

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4.51 market (n) /'mɑ:kɪt/ - trh
a place where you can go to buy or sell things on a street or in a special building • *People buy fruit and vegetables at the street market here on Tuesdays.* ➤ market (v) ❖

4.52 sandwich (n) /'sænwɪtʃ/ - obložený chleba

a snack that you make from two pieces of bread put together with food in between them • *Would you like a cheese and tomato sandwich?* ❖

4.53 actually (adv) /'æktʃuəli/ - vlastně; ve skutečnosti
in fact • *I didn't know that Marie was actually from France.* ➤ actual (adj) ❖

4.54 prediction (n) /prɪ'dɪkʃn/ - předpověď
what sb says will happen in the future • *What's my prediction for the match? Roger's team will win again.* ➤ predict (v), predictable (adj) ❖

4.55 hope (v) /həʊp/ - doufat
to wish that sth good is possible • *I hope Grandad will enjoy his dinner.* ➤ hope (n) ❖

4.56 sure (adj) /ʃʊə(r)/ - jistý
certain of sth • *I'm sure you'll like this cake.* ❖

4.57 offer (n) /'ɒfə(r)/ - nabídka
an act of saying that you will do sth for sb if they need help • *Charles made a kind offer to wash the dishes.* ➤ offer (v) ❖

4.58 promise (n) /'prɒmɪs/ - slib
an act of saying that you will do sth for sure
• *I'll make the best chocolate cake in the world. That's a promise!* ➤ promise (v) ❖

4.59 sudden (adj) /'sʌdn/ - náhlý;
nečekaný

that happens fast when you don't expect it

• *We were watching TV, when we heard a sudden noise outside.* ➤ suddenly (adv) ❖

4.60 decision (n) /di'siʒn/ - rozhodnutí a choice you make after thinking about sth

• *Paul made a decision to become a cook.* ➤ decide (v) ❖

4.61 ham (n) /hæm/ - šunka

a kind of meat from a pig's leg • *Do you want a ham and cheese sandwich?* ❖

4.62 I'm afraid (phr) /aɪm ə'freɪd/ - obávám se

used to introduce sth that isn't good or to say that you're sorry about sth • *I'm afraid I can't meet you tomorrow. I'll be at my grandparents' house.* ❖

4.63 restaurant (n) /'restrɒnt/ - restaurace a place where you can sit and buy meals to eat • *Sometimes I eat at a restaurant with my family.* ❖

4.64 fantastic (adj) /fæn'tæstɪk/ - fantastický

very good; wonderful • *Greta had a fantastic holiday in Crete with her family. They want to go back there next year.* ❖

4.65 as well (phr) /əz wel/ - také also; too • *I'm not very hungry. I can't eat fish with salad and have ice cream as well.* ❖

4.66 answer (the phone) (v) /'ɑ:nsə(r) (ðə fəʊn)/ - zvednout telefon to pick up the phone when sb calls • *Don't answer the phone! It will be somebody selling something again.* ➤ answer (n) ❖

4.67 pass (v) /pɑ:s/ - udělat (zkoušku apod.) to do well in an exam, a course, etc. • *I hope you'll pass your French exam.* ➤ pass (n) ❖

4.68 anyway (adv) /'eniweɪ/ - naznačení změny tématu v konverzaci used to change the subject to a main point in a conversation • *It's a bit late to eat now. Anyway, shall we watch a film?* ❖

4.69 luck (n) /lʌk/ - štěstí sth that makes sth good or bad happen by

chance • *Good luck with your new cookbook.* ➤ lucky (adj) ❖

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4.70 add (v) /æd/ - přidat to put sth in sth else • *Add a little salt to the soup.* ➤ addition (n) ❖


4.71 last (adv) /lɑ:st/ - naposledy; konečně after all other things • *We waited a long time in the restaurant and they brought our food last.* ❖

4.72 item (n) /'aɪtəm/ - položka; věc an object • *I made a list of items that I needed to buy for the meal.* ❖

4.73 form (n) /fɔ:m/ - druh a kind • *What form of transport do you prefer to use? A car or a bus?* ❖

4.74 underline (v) /,ʌndə'laɪn/ - podtrhnout to draw a line under a word • *I underlined this word because I like it.* ❖

4.75 girlfriend (n) /'gɜ:lfrɛnd/ - přítelkyně a close female friend • *My brother is going to the cinema with his girlfriend.* ❖

4.76 popular (adj) /'pɒpjələ(r)/ - oblíbený liked by many people • *Is tennis a popular sport in your country?* ➤ popularity (n) ❖  Opp: unpopular

4.77 seafood (n) /'si:fu:d/ - plody moře any fish and other sea creatures that you can eat • *We ate fresh seafood at the restaurant by the beach.* ❖

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4.78 taco (n) /'tækəʊ/ - tacos a small Mexican flat bread filled with different food and often served with chilli sauce • *At this Mexican restaurant, they make great cheese tacos.* ❖

4.79 nacho (n) /'nɑ:tʃəʊ/ - nachos a small piece of fried Mexican bread often eaten with a sauce or cheese • *Let's buy some nachos for our film night.* ❖

4.80 smoothie (n) /'smu:ði/ - ovocný koktejl
a drink made from fruit or vegetables mixed with fruit juice, milk or yoghurt • *I had a banana and apple smoothie for breakfast.* ❖

4.81 vanilla (n) /və'nɪlə/ - vanilka
a sweet flavouring made from the seeds of a plant that we add to give taste to food like cakes or ice cream • *Which ice cream do you like best? Chocolate, strawberry or vanilla?* ❖

4.82 garlic bread (n) /,gɑ:lɪk 'bred/ - česnekový chleba
bread heated with garlic and butter inside
• *In Italian restaurants, you can have garlic bread with your pasta.* ❖

4.83 Mediterranean (adj) – Středozevní /,medɪtə'reɪniən/
of the sea between Europe and Africa and its coasts > the Mediterranean (n)
❖

4.84 tuna (n) /'tju:nə/ - tuňák
a large sea fish with red meat • *Tony makes delicious pizza with tuna and other seafood.* ❖

4.85 curry (n) /'kʌrɪ/ - kari
a type of Asian food with a hot spicy sauce
• *Indian curry with rice is a popular meal in the UK.* > curry (v) ❖

4.86 chocolate brownie (n) /'tʃɒklət 'braʊni/ - čokoládový řez
a kind of square chocolate cake • *How many eggs do I need to make chocolate brownies?* ❖

4.87 takeaway (n) /'teɪkəweɪ/ - jídlo s sebou
a meal that you can collect or order from a restaurant to eat somewhere else
• *Thomas was too tired to cook, so he ordered a takeaway.* > take away (phr v)
❖

4.88 busy (adj) /'bɪzi/ - zaneprázdněný; rušný
that has a lot of people • *The streets are always busy in the morning.* ❖

4.89 crowded (adj) /'kraʊdɪd/ - přečpaný (lidmi)
that has a lot of people close together
• *This café is very crowded. We can't sit down here.* > crowd (n) ❖

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4.90 biscuit (n) /'bɪskɪt/ - sušenka (UK)
a thin crispy cake • *Have a biscuit with your hot chocolate.* ❖

4.91 pre-heat (v) /,pri:'hi:t/ - předeřtát
to switch on an oven to make it hot before cooking food in it • *Pre-heat the oven to 180°C while you're mixing the ingredients.*
> preheated (adj) ❖

4.92 oven (n) /'ʌvən/ - trouba (na pečení)
the inside part of a cooker where food is cooked • *The cakes are still in the oven. They will be ready soon.* ❖

4.93 almond (n) /'ɑ:mənd/ - mandle
a small oval nut with a smooth hard shell
• *There are some almonds in this cake.* ❖

4.94 dough (n) /dəʊ/ - těsto
a mixture of flour and other ingredients used to make bread, pies or biscuits • *The cook mixed the dough and left it in the fridge for an hour.* ❖

4.95 bake (v) /beɪk/ - péct
to cook food in an oven • *Put the biscuits in the oven and bake them for 15 minutes.*
> baker, baking (n), baked (adj) ❖

4.96 chopped (adj) /tʃɒpt/ - sekaný; krájený
sth cut into small pieces with a knife • *Put the chopped carrots and onions in the soup.* > chop (v) ❖

4.97 gram (n) /græm/ - gram
a small unit for measuring how heavy sth is • *You'll need 250 grams of butter for this recipe.* ❖

4.98 icing sugar (n) /'aɪsɪŋ ʃʊgə(r)/ - moučkový cukr
a kind of soft white sugar usually used on the top of cakes or biscuits • *Cheryl is*

going to put some icing sugar on the brownies. ❖

4.99 flour (n) /'flaʊə(r)/ - mouka
a soft white or brown powder made from wheat or other grain, used to make bread, biscuits, cakes, etc. • *Put the flour into a bowl with the butter and sugar.* ❖

4.100 flavouring (n) /'fleivəriŋ/ - příchut'; ochucovadlo

sth added to food to give it more taste
• *This biscuit has strawberry flavouring.*

➤ flavour (n, v) ❖

4.101 finally (adv) /'faɪnəli/ - nakonec
at the end • *Finally, cut the cake and eat it.* ➤ final (n, adj) ❖

4.102 mix (v) /mɪks/ - smíchat
to put two or more things together to make sth different • *Mix the butter and sugar before you add the eggs.* ➤ mixture (n) ❖

4.103 spoon (n) /spu:n/ - lžíce
an object that has a long handle with a small round bowl shape at the end, used for mixing or picking up food • *Henry was eating his soup with a silver spoon.* ❖

4.104 roll out (phr v) /rəʊl aʊt/ - rozválet
to make sth flat using a special kitchen tool or your hands • *Roll out the dough and put it into the baking tin.* ❖

4.105 board (n) /bɔ:d/ - deska
a thin flat piece of wood or plastic, etc. often used for preparing food • *Chop the carrots on the board.* ❖

4.106 piece (n) /pi:s/ - kus
a part of sth • *Have a piece of cake.* ❖

4.107 occasion (n) /ə'keɪzən/ - příležitost
an event; a specific time when sth happens • *Maisie wears a dress on special occasions, like parties or weddings.* ❖

4.108 measurement (n) /'meʒəmənt/ - míra; velikost
how big, heavy, long or hot, etc. sth is
• *The recipe has all the measurements for the ingredients of the cake.* ➤ measure (v)
❖

4.109 centimetre (n) /'sentɪmi:tə(r)/ - centimetr

a small unit for measuring how long or high sth is or how tall sb is • *There are 100 centimetres in a metre.* ❖ 📏 Abbrev: cm

4.110 metre (n) /'mi:tə(r)/ - metr
a unit for measuring how long or high sth is or how tall sb is; 100cm • *The table is two metres long.* ❖ 📏 Abbrev: m

4.111 kilo (n) /'ki:ləʊ/ - kilogram
a unit for measuring how heavy sb or sth is; 1,000 grams; a kilogram • *I'll buy a kilo of tomatoes at the market.* ❖

4.112 degree (n) /di'grɪ:/ - stupeň
a unit used to measure temperature • *The oven needs to be 20 degrees hotter.* ❖

4.113 kilometre (n) /ki'lɒmɪtə(r)/ - kilometr
a unit used to measure distance; 1,000 metres • *Our house is four kilometres from the school.* 📏 Abbrev: km ❖

4.114 length (n) /leŋkθ/ - délka
how long sth is • *What's the length of the room?* ➤ long (adj), lengthen (v) ❖

4.115 weight (n) /weɪt/ - hmotnost
how heavy sth is • *Check the weight of your bags before you travel by plane.* ➤ weigh (v) ❖

4.116 temperature (n) /'temprətʃə(r)/ - teplota
how hot or cold sb or sth is • *The temperature is very low in Greenland in winter.* ❖

4.117 pot (n) /pɒt/ - hrnec; sklenice
a container for keeping food fresh • *There's a pot of yoghurt on the table.* ❖

4.118 yoghurt (n) /'jɒgə(r)t/ - jogurt
a thick white food made from milk that you can eat with fruit or other flavourings
• *I often have yoghurt and fruit for breakfast.* ❖

4.119 oil (n) /ɔɪl/ - olej
a thick liquid, usually made from plants, used for cooking or preparing food • *Dad always puts oil on salads.* ➤ oil (v), oily (adj) ❖

4.120 first of all (phr) /fɜːst əv ɔːl/ - zaprvé before anything else • *First of all, look for a nice recipe.* ❖ 📖 Syn: firstly

4.121 Celsius (n) /ˈselsiəs/ - Celsius the measure used for temperatures in centigrade • *Water boils at 100 degrees Celsius.* ❖

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4.122 dollar (n) /ˈdɒlə(r)/ - dolar the kind of money used in some countries, e.g. the USA, Canada and Australia • *The taxi ride from the airport costs 40 dollars.* ❖

4.123 furniture (n) /ˈfɜːnɪtʃə(r)/ - nábytek things like tables, chairs, cupboards, etc. • *We're buying new furniture for the living room.* ❖

4.124 advice (n) /ədˈvaɪs/ - rada sth you tell sb to help them with a problem • *Ask your granny for advice in the kitchen. She's a great cook!* ➤ advise (v), advisable (adj) ❖

4.125 luggage (n) /ˈlʌɡɪdʒ/ - zavazadlo/zavazadla all the bags you carry when you're travelling • *Simon's putting his luggage into the car to go on holiday.* ❖

4.126 news (n) /njuːz/ - zpráva; zprávy a piece of information about sth new that happened • *I've got some good news. I'm going to be in Happy Cook on TV!* ❖

4.127 equipment (n) /iˈkwɪpmənt/ - vybavení the things you need to do a job or an activity • *The school has modern equipment in the computer lab.* ❖

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4.128 try out (phr v) /traɪ aʊt/ - vyzkoušet to use or do sth to see how good or bad it is • *Bob and Martha are going to try out the new Indian restaurant.* ❖

4.129 tour (n) /tʊə(r)/ - prohlídka

a trip to visit different places or parts of a place • *We went on a tour of the castle.* ➤ tour (v) ❖

4.130 excited (adj) /ɪkˈsaɪtɪd/ - nadšený feeling very happy about sth you're doing or going to do • *The children are excited about going to the party.* ❖

4.131 fortune cookie (n) /ˈfɔːtʃuːn kʊki/ - koláček štěstí a thin Chinese biscuit with a small note inside that says sth about your future • *My fortune cookie says I'll get a visit from a friend.* ❖

4.132 come round (phr v) /kʌm raʊnd/ - stavit se (na návštěvu) to come to a place for a short visit • *My friends often come round to my house to listen to music.* ❖

4.133 lovely (adj) /ˈlʌvli/ - příjemný; chutný nice; enjoyable • *We had a lovely meal at Francine's.* ❖

4.134 look forward to (phr v) /lʊk ˈfɔːwəd tu/ - těšit se na to be happy waiting for sth good that is going to happen • *Are you looking forward to your holiday?* ❖

4.135 pretty (adv) /ˈprɪti/ - docela quite • *The food at Jerry's is pretty good. You'll love it!* ❖

4.136 sound (v) /saʊnd/ - znít to seem to be a particular way, from what you hear or read • *The new Thai restaurant sounds fantastic! Let's try it out.* ➤ sound (n) ❖

4.137 a bit (adv) /ə bɪt/ - trochu a little; a small amount • *The players were a bit tired at the end of the match.* ❖

4.138 relaxing (adj) /rɪˈlæksɪŋ/ - uvolňující; odpočinkový helping you to rest • *A day at the beach will be relaxing.* ➤ relax (v), relaxation (n) ❖

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4.139 eyeball (n) /'aɪbɔ:l/ - oční bulva
a complete eye, including the round part
at the back • *I can't imagine eating an
animal's eyeballs.* ❖

4.140 blood (n) /blʌd/ - krev
the red liquid that flows inside your body
• *There was blood on my shirt because I
cut my finger.* ❖

4.141 tortilla (n) /tɔ:'ti:ə/ - tortilla
a thin, flat Mexican bread • *Pablo is eating
tortillas with cheese and tomato.* ❖

4.142 larva (n) /'lɑ:və/ - larva
an insect when it first comes out of its egg
